The best part is when the castle staff 'tortured' the teachers with medieval gadgets'. By Leah and Owen

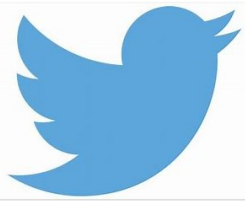


Y3/4 Visit to Great North Museum
