


We certainly do have resilient children!

KEEPING SAFE

Can we politely ask parents/carers to wear a mask when collecting your children from school. With the higher level of lockdown, we feel it would help to keep yourself, staff and others safe.



COVID 19 MESSAGE

We would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone of the Government guidance, and we will try to keep it simple.

If you, or anyone in your household develops Covid symptoms (high temperature, persistent new cough, loss of taste and smell) you need to stay at home and arrange a test online. This can take time, but please be persistent.

Some people have been unable to arrange a test but have attended a walk-in test centre (old General Hospital site), the advice however is to book first.

The <u>IMPORTANT</u> message is that <u>ALL</u> members of the household must self - isolate until the test results come back. This means you must all stay at home — you are not allowed to go to shops, go for walks or go to work or school.

If the test result is **NEGATIVE**, and the person feels well, you can all stop isolating. If **POSITIVE**, you must self isolate for 14 days, you **MUST** inform school and inform **TEST AND TRACE**.

It is strange times at the moment but if we all follow the guidance, we will all stay safe. Further information can be found at:


Important Notice
