THE CURRICULUM – WHAT DO WE TEACH?

At Broadwood Primary School we follow the National Curriculum. The children receive a broad and balanced curriculum featuring the full range of primary subjects.

We group children for reading and phonics activities. Children have the opportunities to read a rich range of texts as we believe this helps them to develop their reading skills, speaking and listening and vocabulary and also learn about things that they can't experience directly. We also do lots of paired reading and partner work as we believe children can learn so many things from working together.

Curriculum Drivers:-

We have designed a curriculum to meet the needs of our children and our main drivers are:-

- Giving children the aspirations to believe that they can do something great with their lives and choose a great job that will make them happy and contribute to society;
- Helping children to develop great communication skills so that they have the ability to speak with a rich vocabulary and are able to listen to, and interact with people, no matter what walk of life they come from.
