For parents and carers

Please help you child by:

- ◆ Encouraging your child's growing independence letting them sort out their own lunchbox, coat, shoes etc. We understand that this takes them time at first and allow for it.
- Listening to them read, or ask them about their books and encourage them to read every day.



- ◆ Practising Maths skills in a friendly and informal way number games, mental arithmetic and table facts—check the school website about free Maths Apps
- ◆Encouraging and supporting them to do their homework by themselves.
- ◆Coming and asking if you or your child have any worries — however small.
- Remember, we have more time to listen after school than in the mornings and other staff are available too.



- Hearing them read regularly at home and signing their reading record book.
- * Making sure they have somewhere quiet to do their homework. Homework will be given out on Mondays to be returned on Fridays.
- * Helping them learn their spellings. <u>Spelling</u>
 <u>Test on Fridays.</u>
- * Making sure they have their **PE Kit** in school on Mondays and Thursdays.
- * Ensuring they have a **fresh bottle** of water every day, it can get quite warm in our class and it is particularly needed on PE days
- * Encouraging them to be in school on time every day. We now allow children in from 8:50 am.
