This year your child will be expected to:

READING


It's really important to read *regularly* at home *every day if possible*!

Your child has been given a 'Reading Journal'. In this they should write all the books they read at home and school. They should read every night and write the page they have read up to, so I can check on their reading progress.

It's important not just to read the words but to think about the story and the characters, what might happen next and why, and why you think a character is behaving in a particular way. When you listen to your child read encourage them to read with expression. If your child comes across an unfamiliar word encourage them to use clues to work out what it might be—it can be jotted down in their reading record

book.

When your child has finished a book they need to bring it back and ask for it to be changed there is no set day for changing books, I shall try to ensure it is changed as soon as possible after your child has finished reading it.




