### Year 4

# PSHE Objectives

#### **Anglo Saxons and Vikings**

We will look at the struggle for power in Britain as the Anglo Saxons and the Vikings invaded

We will use maps, atlases and digital/computer mapping to describe features studied – including thinking about choices made for location of settlements – are they the best?

We will use the eight points of a compass, symbols and a key (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps) to build their knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world.
