Maths Objectives

Children count reliably with numbers from one to 20, place them in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number. Using quantities and objects, they add and subtract two single-digit numbers and count on or back to find the answer. They solve problems, including doubling, halving and sharing.

Children use everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money to compare quantities and objects and to solve problems.

Understanding the World

Children to learn about similarities and differences in the context of families, objects, places and living things.

They make observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur, and talk about what they notice.
